Adams, Richard	Watership Down	An Aeneid-like adventure novel of anthropomorphized rabbits in England trying to survive after the destruction of their home.
Boulle, Pierre	Bridge Over the River Kwai, The	Novel dealing with British soldiers in a Japanese POW camp during World War 2 and the ways they resist their capturers.
Bradbury, Ray	Fahrenheit 451	Dystopian novel about a future America where books are outlawed and "firemen" burn any that are found. One of Bradbury's best books.
Christie, Agatha	And Then There Were None	Detective fiction novel about 10 people, previously complicit in the deaths of others but having escaped notice and/or punishment, and who are tricked onto an island and each mysteriously murdered one by one.
Christie, Agatha	Curtain	Detective novel in which all the characters and the murder itself are set in one country house.
Christie, Agatha	Murder of Roger Ackroyd	One of Christie's masterpiece detective novels. The way the book ends has left an impact on the genre of crime novels.
Christie, Agatha	Murder on the Orient Express	Detective fiction novel about a detective's attempts to solve a murder that occurs on the train he's riding through the Middle-East back to Europe.
Crichton, Michael	Andromeda Strain, The	Thriller novel documenting the efforts of a team of scientists investigating a deadly extraterrestrial microorganism which rapidly and fatally clots human blood, while inducing insanity in some people.
De Wohl, Louis	St. Joan: The Girl Soldier	Historical novel about Joan of Arc.
Defoe, Daniel	Robinson Crusoe	Excellent story of a ship-wrecked Englishman and his struggle with basic survival, native savages, and the meaning and reason behind his solitary existence.
Doyle, Sir Arthur Conan	The Hound of the Baskervilles	Detective novel featuring Sherlock Holmes. Tells the story of an attempted murder inspired by the legend of a fearsome, diabolical hound of supernatural origin.
Doyle, Sir Arthur Conan	Complete Sherlock Holmes, The	Stories about the brilliant detective Holmes, who is famous for his intellectual prowess and is renowned for his skillful use of astute observation, deductive reasoning and forensic skills to solve difficult cases.
Gilbreth, Frank	Cheaper by the Dozen	Biographical novel about a couple and their twelve children
Lewis, C.S.	Space Trilogy, The: Volume 1: Out of the Silent Planet	Part 1 of gripping trilogy. Deals with what Lewis saw as the dehumanizing trends in contemporary science fiction.

McLean, Alistair	Guns of Navarrone, The	The story concerns the efforts of an Allied commando team to destroy a seemingly impregnable German fortress that threatens Allied naval ships in the Aegean Sea, and prevents over 1,200 isolated British troops from being rescued. The story is based on the real events surrounding the Battle of Leros in World War II.
McLean, Alistair	H.M.S. Ulysses	Novel about a British light cruiser's battle against German U-boats as it attempts to escort a convoy of ships to Murmansk.
Moody, Ralph	Little Britches: Father and I Were Ranchers (and series)	Autobiographical account of a family's move from the East coast to the West (Colorado) in the early 20 th century and the struggles they face.
Orczy, Baroness	Scarlet Pimpernel, The	Novel about an English aristocrat who pretends to be a weak foppish figure but in reality saves French noblemen from the French Revolution's guillotine.
Sabatini, Rafael	Captain blood	Story of the adventures of Peter Blood: doctor, prisoner, pirate, hero.
Sienkiewicz, Henryk	Trilogy—Part 1: With Fire and Sword	Phenomenal epic novel (part 1 of 3) about war and heroism in the glory days of 17 th century Poland.
Sienkiewicz, Henryk	Trilogy—Part 2: The Deluge	Phenomenal epic novel (part 2 of 3) about war and heroism in the glory days of 17 th century Poland.
Sienkiewicz, Henryk	Trilogy—Part 3: Fire in the Steppe	Phenomenal epic novel (part 3 of 3) about war and heroism in the glory days of 17 th century Poland.
Stevenson, Robert L	Treasure Island	Story of a boy and how he gets caught up in a race against pirates to find a hidden treasure.

Cather, Willa	Death Comes for the Archbishop	Beautifully written fictional account of Bishop Lamy's task to set up a new diocese in Santa Fe after the Mexican-American War.
Roberts, Kenneth	Arundel	Good historical novel about life in America during early America.
Roberts, Kenneth	Rabble in Arms	Historical novel about Benedict Arnold and the American Revolutionary War.
Ryan, Cornelius	Bridge Too Far, A	Historical novel about the failed attempt to end the Second World War by Christmas 1944.
Ryan, Cornelius	Longest Day, The	Historical novel about D-Day, June 6, 1944.
Shaara, Michael	Killer Angels, The	Historical fiction account of the Battle of Gettysburg. Won the Pulitzer Prize, and called the best war narrative since Stephen Crane's Red Badge of Courage.
Sienkiewicz, Henryk	Quo Vadis	Historical account of the Nero, the early Christians, the burning of Rome, and the relationship between a young Roman soldier-aristocrat and a Christian girl.
Solzhenitsyn, Alexander	One Day in the Life of Ivan Denisovich	Novel set in a Soviet labor camp in the 1950s. Describes a single day in the life of an ordinary prisoner. It was the first work detailing Stalinist repression that was openly distributed.
Stevenson, Robert L	Black Arrow, The	An historical adventure novel and romance set during the Wars of the Roses.
Stevenson, Robert L	Kidnapped	A historical novel that tells of the boy David Balfour's pursuit of his inheritance and his alliance with Alan Breck in the intrigues of Jacobite troubles in Scotland.
Wallace, Lew	Ben-Hur	Novel set in the time of Christ. The central character is Judah, prince of the Hebrew house of Hur. Judah grows up in Jerusalem, during the turbulent years around the birth of Christ. His best friend is Messala, a Roman. As adults Judah and Messala become rivals, each hating the other, which leads to Judah's downfall and eventual triumph.

Austen, Jane	Persuasion	A young woman named Anne Elliot was persuaded not to marry a navy captain with no fortune, ancestry, or prospects, but when he returns home 7 years later she starts to believe in second chances.
Austen, Jane	Pride and Prejudice	Story of how a woman deals with issues of manners, morals, education, upbringing, and marriage in the society of landed gentry in early 19 th century England.
Austen, Jane	Sense and Sensibility	Work of romantic fiction about two sisters in England in the late 18 th century.
Benson, Robert Hugh	Lord of the World	Insightful and interesting apocalyptic novel.
Bolt, Robert	Man for all Seasons, A	Historical play about Thomas More's struggle to preserve law and truth against the tyranny of Henry VIII in making himself head of the Church in England, ending with the heroic martyrdom of More.
Cather, Willa	My Antonia	The final book of the prairie trilogy, about immigrant families moving to start new lives in Nebraska.
Cooper, James Fenimore	Last of the Mohicans, The	Historical adventure novel about the relationship between American settlers and different warring Indian tribes.
Crane, Stephen	Red Badge of Courage, The	Historical novel on the Civil War and one soldier's role in it.
Dante	Divine Comedy, The: Inferno, Purgatorio, Paradiso	One of the greatest works of literature in history, covering a trek through purgatory, hell, and heaven. Beautiful poetry infused with philosophical and theological thought.
Dickens, Charles	Christmas Carol, A	Story of sour and stingy Ebenezer Scrooge's ideological, ethical, and emotional transformation after the supernatural visitations of Jacob Marley and the Ghosts of Christmases Past, Present and Yet to Come.
Dickens, Charles	David Copperfield	Story of a boy who loses his parents at an early age, and who escapes the torture of working for his pitiless stepfather to try to make something of himself and, with any luck, find true happiness.
Dickens, Charles	Oliver Twist	Enjoyable classic from the pen of a great storyteller.
Dickens, Charles	Tale of Two Cities, A	Story of the plight of an innocent French aristocrat, his bride, her long-suffering father, and her loyal English caretaker as they are all caught up in the blood and death of the French Revolution.
Dostoyevsky, Fyodor	Brothers Karamazov, The	A fervent, philosophical novel that explores deep into the truths of God, free will, and morality. It tells the story of an intellectual Ivan, sensual Dmitri, and idealistic Alyosha Karamazov, who collide in the wake of their despicable father's brutal murder.
Dostoyevsky, Fyodor	Crime and Punishment	Classic study about conscience written by the great Russian writer: challenging but worthwhile.

Homer	Iliad, The	First great work of western literature. A truly epic poem detailing a cross-section of the Trojan War, with deep insights into man, virtue, and immortality.
Homer	Odyssey, The	Sequel to the Iliad, detailing the 10 year struggle for Odysseus to return home and save his wife and home from being taken by those who stayed behind from the Trojan War.
Lee, Harper	To Kill a Mockingbird	Classic novel of a lawyer in the Deep South defending a black man charged with the rape of a white girl.
NA	Beowulf	Medieval epic poem about the hero Beowulf's quest to save a people from a mythical monster. One of the major pieces of Old English literature.
Orwell, George	Animal Farm	Novel about animals who take over a farm; allegory of communism.
Shakespeare, William	Hamlet	The play, set in Denmark, recounts how Prince Hamlet exacts revenge on his uncle Claudius, who has murdered Hamlet's father, the King, and then taken the throne and married Gertrude, Hamlet's mother. The play vividly charts the course of real and feigned madness—from overwhelming grief to seething rage—and explores themes and various forms of moral corruption.
Shakespeare, William	Julius Caesar	It portrays the conspiracy against the Roman dictator of the same name, his assassination and its aftermath. Although the title of the play is Julius Caesar, Caesar is not the central character in its action; he appears in only three scenes, and is killed at the beginning of the third act. The protagonist of the play is Marcus Brutus, and the central psychological drama is his struggle between the conflicting demands of honor, patriotism, and friendship.
Shakespeare, William	King Lear	Tragedy of King Lear's failure to see which daughters and subjects are good and bad. The evil subjects revolt, and those loyal defend him. One of Shakespeare's greatest works.
Shakespeare, William	Macbeth	Tragedy in which Macbeth and his wife overthrow and murder King Duncan but later suffer retribution for their evil deeds.
Steinbeck, John	Pearl, The	Novella about a pearl diver, Kino, and explores man's nature as well as greed and evil.
Tolkien, JRR	Hobbit, The	Novel about Bilbo Baggins and how he comes into possession of the Ring of Power.
Tolkien, JRR	Lord of the Rings, The	Epic novel in the mythical world of Middle-Earth about the war and quest to defeat the forces of evil who seek to conquer all others.
Tolstoy, Leo	Anna Karenina	Greatest novel of Tolstoy, tells the story of 2 figures: the rebellious, sensual Anna and the self-doubting agnostic Levin and the struggle of both for fulfillment and happiness.
Tolstoy, Leo	Death of Ivan Ilyich	Novella about the death, at age 45, of a high-court judge in 19 th -century Russia. The story focuses on how this man, who did not lead a good life, comes to grips ever so painfully with the fact that he is going to die.

Twain, Mark	Huckleberry Finn	Unlike Tom Sawyer, this is not a children's book. It has been called the greatest American novel and has insights that only adults can fully appreciate. It is, besides, hilariously funny.
Virgil	Aeneid	Classic piece of western literature. Picking up on the tradition of Homer, Virgil tells the epic story of Aeneas' struggle to reach Italy and the wars required to settle finally the wandering Trojans in their new home, which eventually would be Rome. Greatest piece of Latin literature.
Waugh, Evelyn	Brideshead Revisited	Wonderful story about the loves, struggles, weaknesses, and redemption of an English Catholic aristocratic family in the early 20 th century.
Wilder, Thornton	Bridge Of San Luis Rey, The	Short but beautifully written story about the lives of several people caught in a tragic accident—how their lives were all touched by love.

Ambrose, Stephen	Eisenhower	Story of the man who was both Supreme Allied Commander during World War II and then one of the first presidents during the Cold War.
Appleby	Thomas Jefferson	Riveting study of the complex and influential man who wrote the Declaration of Independence, was a southern slave-owning plantation owner, and shaped the American democracy decisively through his presidency and many other offices.
Augustine, St	Confessions	The first of all autobiographies and still one of the greatest.
Barlow	Thomas Becket	Biography of the man who went from being the handsome, worldly courtier to the zealous prelate, exile, and saint-martyr. A very interesting figure.
Boom, Corrie Ten	Hiding Place, The	Autobiographical account of a Dutch family which hid Jews in their home during World War II to save them from the Nazis
Brands, HW	First American, The	Comprehensive and readable biography of Benjamin Franklin.
Cartledge, Paul	Alexander the Great	Discusses the life of the man who conquered most of the known world before dying at the age of 33, thereby making Greek culture and language known everywhere.
Chernow, Ron	Alexander Hamilton	Founding father and first secretary of the Treasury.
Chernow, Ron	Washington: A Life	Great one-volume biography of George Washington.

Catton, Bruce	Part 3 of 3: Never Call Retreat	The war continues through Vicksburg, Gettysburg, and the bloody struggles of 1864 and 1865 before the final surrender.

Fischer, David Hackett	Washington's Crossing	Well written account of Washington's crossing the Delaware River and the New Jersey campaign of 1777, a turning point in the American Revolution.
Hamilton, Edith	Greek Way, The	The best short introduction to the Greeks and who they were.
Hamilton, Edith	Roman Way, The	The best short introduction to the Romans and who they were.
Herodotus	Persian Wars, The	Written by the "father of history", this tells the epic story of the background leading to and the events of the 5 th century B.C. wars between the Persians and the Greeks.
Hillenbrand, Laura	Seabiscuit	Exciting story of Seabiscuit, one of the greatest race horses of the 1930's, and of the colorful characters involved in his training and racing. One of the best sports narratives of recent times, an excellent read.
