WITH FIRE AND SWORD

I have a friend who has been encouraging me to read the book, *With Fire and Sword* by Henryk Sienkiewicz for the last several years. He claimed that it was one of the best books ever and that I would really enjoy reading it. I was excited until I saw the book itself. It's almost 1,200 pages long. I've never read a single book that long before in my life and, to be honest, I wasn't that interested in spending months slogging through the same long book.

But a few weeks ago, I chose it as a quarantine novel, and all of that changed. *With Fire and Sword* is a historical fiction set during the Khmelnytsky Uprising in 1648 when Zaporozhian Cossacks allied with the Crimean Tatars and local Ukrainian peasants to rebel against Polish rule. It has a little bit of everything - adventure, drama, comedy and a bunch of Polish, Ukrainian, and Lithuanian knights killing the bad guys (including one who has a life goal of cutting three guys' heads off with one swing of his sword). I've actually learned a lot about Polish history and geography, and even some Polish words (although I have no idea how to pronounce them or almost any of the names in the book).

After a few weeks of reading for a few minutes every day, I'm about a third of the way through the book and now, I look for opportunities - even if only for five minutes - to read a couple more pages throughout the day. It's a long book, but is actually a pretty easy read, so I recommend it to all of you, especially anyone who is Polish or Ukrainian. Even if, like me, you have no ties to Poland or Ukraine and know close to nothing about the history, you'll find it enjoyable. When you finish all 1,200 pages, the great news is that it's the first book in a trilogy so there's a lot more where those 1,200 pages came from.
